HE IS RISEN!

The Resurrection account in John begins with Mary Magdalene arriving alone at the tomb. Although John tells us nothing about why she went, he does say when: it was dark. Upon seeing the stone removed, she fled to Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved, the key disciples in the Gospel according to John. They ran, looked inside the tomb, and realized from the careful placement of the cloths that there had been no robbery. Coming out of the darkness of confusion, they began to believe. But, John tells us, they had not yet understood the meaning of the Scriptures, so they returned home. In the post-Resurrection narrative that follows, which we do not hear in the Sunday Lectionary, the Risen Lord appears to Mary, calls her by name, and tells her to return to the disciples, this time declaring the message of the Resurrection. As Jesus's disciples grasped that message, they realized what God had done for Jesus, for them, and for the whole world.

This years celebration of the Triduum was truly one of the most meaningful experiences of our Lord's passion, death and Resurrection.
